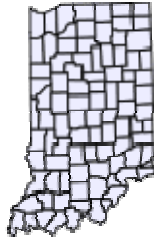


Indiana in Profile



Indiana is one of 50 states in the United States (ranks include the District of Columbia). It has 35,866.9 sq. miles in land area and a population density of 174.9 per square mile. In the last three decades of the 1900s its population grew by 17.0%. On the 2000 census form, 98.8% of the population reported only one race, with 8.4% of these reporting African-American. The population of this state is 3.5% Hispanic (of any race). The average household size is 2.53 persons compared to an average family size of 3.05 persons.

In 2005 manufacturing was the largest of 20 major sectors. It had an average wage per job of \$48,224. Per capita income grew by 14.1% between 1994 and 2004 (adjusted for inflation).
